Shot Clock Quick Guide

Initiate a shot clock

1. Possession inside attack area
2. Possession after the 10-second count is satisfied

Reset a shot clock to 60-seconds after offense regains possession

1. In the attack area following a defensive possession (if outside attack area 10-second count)
2. A valid shot hits goalkeeper or goal pipe
3. A live ball technical foul on defense
4. The resumption of play after administration for a defensive penalty
5. An inadvertent horn with offense in possession or entitled to possession

Shot Clock Quick Guide (cont.)

End a shot clock

1. A valid shot
2. Defense gains possession
3. Goal
4. 60 seconds expires without a valid shot
5. A valid shot returns to defensive half of the field
6. End of period unless an extra-player situation

Shot Clock Quick Guide (cont.)

Allow a shot clock to continue to run

1. During a flag down foul on defense and possession has not changed
2. A ball that returns to defensive half of the field caused by the defense

Shot clock will stop. Then restart with game clock from the point of stoppage

1. The ball or a shot goes out of bounds, no change of possession or violation
2. Team timeout
3. Officials timeout
4. Injury
5. Equipment issues
6. Inadvertent whistle or flag
7. Extra-player situations at end of period with offense in possession

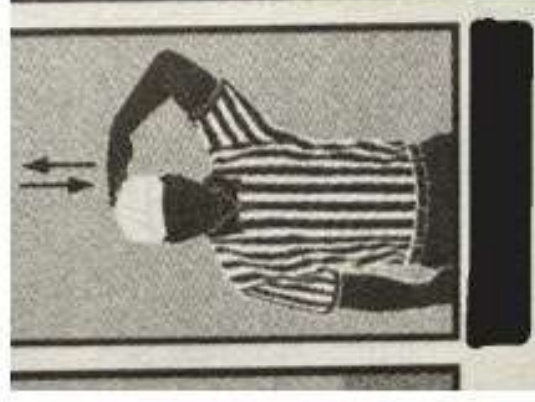

Shot Clock Fast Facts

- **Schools are supposed to provide TWO visible shot clocks, one at each end of the field**
 - A school may place ONE visible shot clock at the midfield line opposite the bench
- **There are procedures for if clock malfunctions OR there is not a clock available at the school**
 - Digital handheld timer with the ability to count down (at the table)
 - Refer to the game clock
 - Table personnel is responsible for this
 - Verbally noted by someone when it will expire + verbal 10 count at the end
 - Air Horn or scoreboard horn is used at the expiration of the shot clock
 - RECOMMENDED - Table personnel write down the times of expiration

(Pre-Game & Face-Offs)



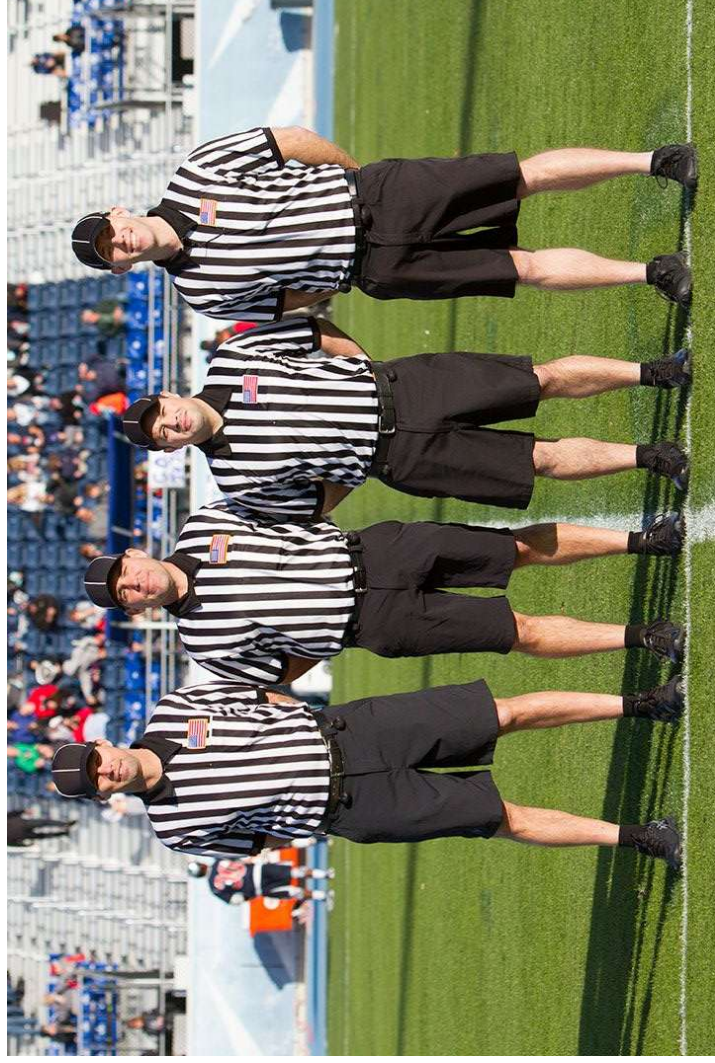
Pre-Game w/ Crew

- Email/text/call partner(s) no later than day before
 - “R” will decide where/when to meet and gear to wear (bring everything)
 - 40-45 min before game time
 - Meet away from fans/teams/buses (Exit Strategy?)

- Factor in: have you worked together, have you had these teams before, open dialogue that allows questions/input




Look the Part - 1st Impressions are Everything!

Instant credibility: Neat/clean appearance, Shirt tucked in, Flags tucked in



Pre-Game (On Field)

- Be on field 20 minutes before game time
- [Coaches Certification Cards](#) 
- Good rule of thumb ~1 min/Coach
- Talk to Captains / Talk to F/O guys
- Talk to table / shot clock personnel
- Go far side, and let teams warm up

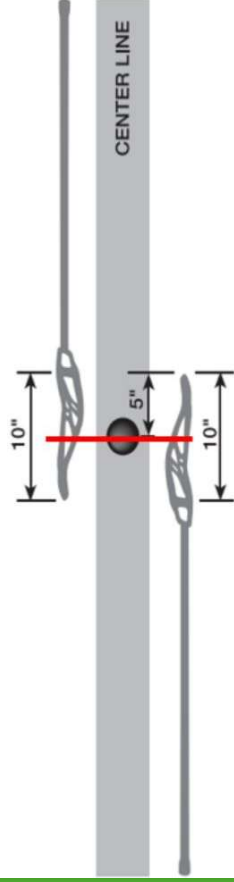
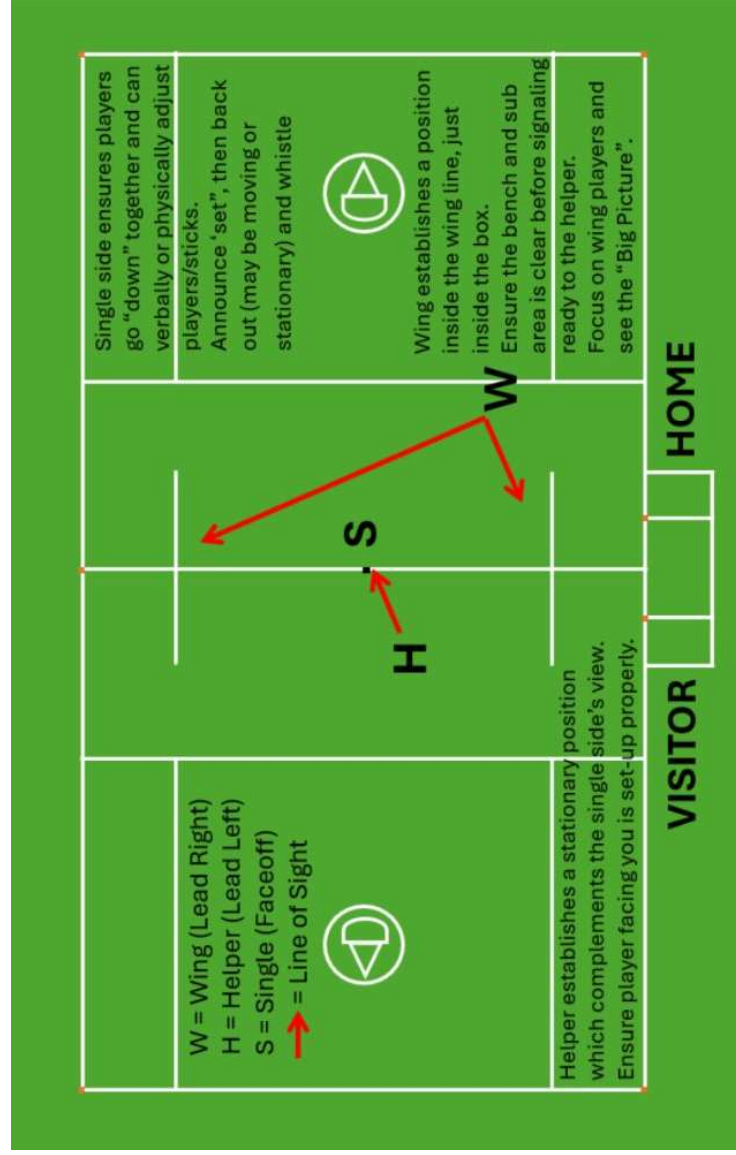
Coaches Certification

The pregame equipment certification by the head coach shall act as the team warning. The head coach shall certify to the referee before the game that all players:

- Have been informed what equipment is mandatory and what constitutes illegal equipment.
- Have been provided the equipment mandated by rule.
- Have been instructed to wear and how to wear mandatory equipment during the game.
- Have been instructed to notify the coaching staff when equipment becomes illegal through play during the game.
- Have had their crosses, uniforms and all other equipment inspected by the head coach for meeting specifications.

Face-off Mechanics (continued)

- Single / Helper / Trail Positions
- We can verbally adjust players' sticks
- Feel free to talk and make adjustments to your positioning
- We want face-offs to go clean every time, talking to guys proactively can help keep this smooth
- “Down, set” start backing away then “Whistle” (no whistle)
